



The Selenophile Revelation

A Selenophile is any person who is attracted by or to the Moon and is best summed up as a "Moon lover." In Greek mythology we find Selene as Goddess of the Moon who drove her chariot across the heavens at night while Helios the Sun God drove his chariot across the sky during the day. In various cultures around the world there is a common theme of the Sun representing the Divine Masculine while the Moon represents the Divine Feminine. In this report we will take a look at your Moon house, sign, phase, and North/South Nodes as well as your Black Moon Lilith, White Moon Selene, Artemis, Diana, Chang'E, Chandra, and Rhiannon who represent aspects of both light and shadow archetypes of Moon Gods and Goddesses respectively.

11th House Cancer

The 11th House represents group identity and group belonging. It is likewise associated with hopes, dreams, and wishes. The 11th House is the area of life that brings together passions and the things one has learned. As an aspect of identity this is where one may begin to feel like they belong to a group, nation, people, family, political group, collective, etc.

One's ambition is able to be realized when they have the cooperation of a group sharing in that vision. Here you get to play out and live your dreams in real life.

Moon

The Moon placed here offers one a highly spiritual energy which allows for the full expression of their emotions. One will be very encouraging of other people's hopes and dreams with a tendency to take care of or play the role of the parent to others. One will enjoy making sure everyone is well fed, safe, and happy. The Cancer Moon is deeply sensitive to the world around them able to sense the emotions of others. This placement has a tendency to fixate on their interactions with others irrespective of the context of the situation at hand. Many people appreciate the raw honest emotional expression the Cancer Moon possesses. There will be a need to retreat from the world frequently to recharge the empathic battery. Be cautious of getting lost in escapist activities such as watching television, substance abuse, or emotional shopping.

Here the desire is to find comfort and familiarity thus one tries to not rock the boat. One has a natural ability that enables them to get in touch with their emotions with being a water sign and having the natural ruler of the Moon in their chart for this placement. There will be a love of peace, stability, and a desire for people to be true to themselves. One holds onto those who make them feel secure, but please be careful of appearing clingy.

4th House Sagittarius

The 4th House needs to lead an authentic life to be happy and is a good placement as it allows one to have enough expansion for emotional growth. However, one might substitute emotional satisfaction with philosophical and mental concerns. One will be open to adventure and seeing the entire world as a place to call home while exploring ideas yet should refrain from becoming a know-it-all.

Chang'E

Chang'E is the Chinese story of Houyi the Lord Archer having saved the world who came into possession of the Elixir of Life which grants immortality and a place in the heavens. His wife Chang'E who was principled and devoted was forced into drinking this potion to keep it from falling into the hands of a wicked man. To honor her the Moon Festival is held during mid-autumn full moon in Asia. This placement in our chart will show where we may go to extreme lengths to guard items we place special value upon. The mythology of Chang'E is used to show us where personal sacrifice should occur in service of the greater good.

Chang'E in Sagittarius seeks fulfillment through the physical senses and the achievement of ideological goals. This placement has an awareness of humankind's practical needs making them capable of structuring people, events, and ideas in their life to achieve the best quality being distributed where it will be most needed. Altruism through Chang'E in Sagittarius is developed through pragmatic modalities when idealism merges with the practical considerations necessary to sustain humankind's overall wellbeing. Here one has been given an added dimension of nurturing self-sacrifice which allows for a very encompassing detachment from one's personal beliefs so that Universal truth may be upheld and met with true wisdom anchoring new archetypes for the betterment of all.

5th House Capricorn and Aquarius Split

One excels in the area of creative pursuits of all kinds within the 5th House. Placements here often show our children and our personal pursuits while revealing what our hobbies are or areas that are going to be of general interest to us. This can also indicate our love affairs and the secondary relationships we may keep.

Chandra

The Hindu pantheon sees Chandra their Moon God as one of the nine planets who is revered for fertility, presiding over pregnancy, childbirth, and motherhood, as well as God of Plants/Vegetables. It is believed Chandra grants strength while providing relief to those plagued by severe challenges and health issues. In the chart Chandra represents Soma, embodies the feminine creative energy of the Universe, and holds significant influence over how we think and feel. This translates into an influence over our attachment level towards objects and people.

Chandra in Aquarius has a degree of impersonality which is actually essential for the world service they will provide lending itself to transitional operations of unconditional love. One will require personal space to feel at ease with the world at large and have a heightened sense of autonomy. They become philanthropists whose logic may run counter to their emotions. Their objective view of reality can create some obstacles in relationships whereby they will adopt into their folds those with similar ideals. The family life can appear at times hodgepodge as they may not keep the one that they were born with rather they will find their soul group later in life. One has a propensity to value humane and compassionate acts as their philosophy of life. This placement marches to the beat of their own drum.

Artemis

With a well-placed Artemis in the chart one may quickly discover that they are perfectionists. Artemis in a chart depicts where one maintains their dignity at all costs, will only give up their vigilance very slowly, and after you have earned their trust. Artemis in mythology had a wild and untamed side making her virginity anything except literal. It indicates where one does not want their sexuality possessed or controlled. Artemis in mythology also loves to stalk her prey yet she despises being stalked herself. In the chart where you find Artemis you will discover where your passion is stimulated by the thrill of the hunt and how you go about protecting the innocent particularly animals and children.

One's legacy may include giving to charities which help contribute to children's causes such as Brown Santa, St. Jude, or Make a Wish. Artemis in Capricorn also has a strong need to support and champion the cause of enabling self-expression as one realizes storytelling, journaling, social media, and publications must allow for the expression of ideas and feelings honestly equipping all to better deal with themselves and another rather than denying or repressing our truth. Artemis in this placement recognizes self-expression as a valid human right. This may come through a form of grass roots or even a business endeavor one will pursue. One may determine that even art is a medium with which they or others can work for wellness and healing. This can be through hobbies or careers in fields such as visual artist, photographer, musician/singer, poet, or author. It is here that one will advocate diverse authenticity is necessary to a well lived life.

North Node and South Node

The North Node in Virgo is symbolic of the soul's urge towards bringing specific aspects of one's personality into the physical world. The South Node on this axis is Pisces which represents gifts brought from a past life incarnation which are already well honed and easy to fall back upon yet will not provide one with much growth in the present incarnation. The Virgo North Node is innately spiritual always seeking to create a sense of routine and ritual in both the spiritual and mundane. This gives one a practical approach to their soul's development.

This placement is not an easy one for Virgo North Node is learning to set boundaries between giving and receiving. One may find they often attract careers and relationships where they feel inadequate which will cause them to overcompensate by making themselves invaluable. The Pisces South Node shows that in the past one may have engaged in escapist tendencies or found themselves in situations where they were manipulated by authorities. Pisces South Node suffers from the identity and archetype of the victim which Virgo North Node is learning to overcome.

This incarnation gives one the opportunities to recognize their own goals and dreams so that they can work towards them. This is one's opportunity to experience life from their perspective with clarity. Compassion is essential for this placement. Virgo North Node feels compelled to crave friendship yet instinctively knows in their past life they never fit in well with any circle of friends. The 11th House placement indicates a lonely child or young adult who has been forced to develop social skills and learn how to be part of a group finding it challenging to follow the ideas of other people.

The Pisces South Node questions individuality and being a part of something bigger than themselves. They are used to being a faceless point in the mass consciousness of the rest of society making it difficult for them to now stand out or apart from the crowd. Without other factors in a chart to help this placement it can be hard for them to accept being the center of attention. One in this placement has a community focus and must learn to appreciate the differences in life to grow. Watch out for arrogance when feeling threatened, becoming involved in unnecessary drama, and letting everyone know when you feel hurt.

Black Moon Lilith

Black Moon Lilith creates a blurring of realities which can become an imbalance if caution is not exercised between one's world of dreams and a grounded reality. They oscillate between overly realistic and escapist tendencies which keep them from pulling their weight in life. This placement needs to error on the side of safety to ensure they don't fall into negative addiction patterns such as alcohol/drugs, sex, or maladaptive daydreams. When this placement is behaving on its highest intended course in one's life we will see creativity and a vivid imagination applied to the arenas of psychology, mythology, and the archetypes. It allows for one to better understand or know themselves as well as another on a very visceral level with which others can only dream to achieve. As they mature this Black Moon Lilith in Pisces will become incredibly wise beyond their years. They excel in psychotherapy, art, photography, acting, writing, and storytelling.

Honoring one's intuition while not allowing for anxiety, worry, or external influences to pressure them into experiences they don't need for self-growth is demanded of Black Moon Lilith in Pisces. Their challenge is to develop stronger boundaries, to develop a more assertive character, and to learn when and how to say no. Be careful of those who seek help as some of them will take advantage of oneself and thus one learns they have placed their hard-earned trust in the wrong people when not cautious. Empathy allows for one to dream of a more perfect world, but make sure this is not an act of repressing or rejecting unpleasant realities and projecting them onto others through jealousy or vindictiveness. This placement needs to integrate their shadow to avoid being the victim of another or giving their power away to another.

8th House Aries

The 8th House will point to one's belongings, inheritances, sexuality, power, risk, losses, desires, temptations, and how they learn to deal with their shadow or darker side of their personality. This house at the hour of birth denotes potential phases of transformations, crisis, and areas of waste in one's life that they would do well to pay attention to and adequately prepare for. The 8th House rules money accumulated through partnership or marriage and more generally other people's money.

White Moon Selene

White Moon Selene shows the path of light called arta, righteousness, truth, and grace. It is mostly used in the Avestan system. Where you find White Moon Selene in your chart is where you must be willing to lose an aspect of embodied reality for the bliss and eternity this placement would bestow. It indicates good karma, following one's bliss without fear, and facets of the personality that are sentient and Divine.

Aries is all about actions so one must take the lead in their life. Letting things go on their own isn't fitting for this placement. They can protect themselves and others by taking charge, showing the way, and being the guard against foreseeable and unforeseen obstacles. Aries is the sign of the warrior so one will have luck on their side when they're fighting, but it needs to be for the right reasons and the pursuit of causes and missions which are for the good of all humanity.

They are a beacon in the dark for those around them acting as a real shepherd placed in charge of a flock. Like it or not others look up to this placement for its pioneering spirit. Here one is able to strike out on a chosen path which others can follow.

9th House Taurus

The 9th House is an area of learning and what goes on in this house will denote areas where one must transform themselves, grow, improve, and further develop from weakness to strength. In other words, the 9th House shows areas of higher learning, growth, and spiritual development that further enhances and supports our relationships, social status, and career goals. This house relates to how one views spirituality, religion, or mystical matters. It shows our relationship to Spirit, God, the Divine, or how well (or not well) connected one is to the collective unconscious. It is the house of divination, journeys, higher education, and self-actualization.

Diana

When we look at Roman mythology we find Diana represents freedom and independence. In the chart she can represent that moment when one may display commitment phobia, a desire for autonomy, spontaneity, and a longing for liberty. Diana famously had a love for Endymion like Selene visiting him only when he was slumbering. In real life this may display as a partner who acts out the Endymion archetype via an addiction to television, computers, video games, or meditation. Whatever the addiction the Endymion archetype is physically there yet not entirely present in the moment. Where Diana is placed within your chart is where you develop a hunter/gatherer instinct. Here there is nothing to do with security, safety, or commitment. It is where you want to perform your way, on your terms, and your own time table.

Within Taurus Diana will be at home in the realms of finance/economy, business, charitable causes, and property. One is gifted with an ability to communicate the complex and abstract concepts to others in a simple down to Earth manner while wanting to prove theories and concepts taken from the metaphysical then applied to the physical realms. You will find Diana in Taurus employs nature, art, and vocal theory while turning their religious or spiritual beliefs into an Earthy sensual view of their world. They are survivalists who might enjoy food and wine enough to publish cookbooks. Or they would do well to work in real estate with their ease for becoming a shrewd business man/woman who has a great poker face, a good deal of enthusiasm, and can talk a good deal. The 9th House is the house of freedom so Diana placed here enhances one's expansion through an ability to generate great wealth and abundance while communicating their brand of wisdom to others so that they can practically achieve similar results.

7th House Pisces

The 7th House seeks to transcend themselves through marriage and one-to-one relationships of partnership and cooperation. They make for an imaginative, selfless, and compassionate partner. One may seek to marry a poet, musician, mystic/spiritual partner (priest, nun, or monk), or a person who works in film and photography. They have a desire to completely merge with their partner yet must beware of any inability to set boundaries.

Rhiannon

Rhiannon is the incarnation of the land as we find in Celtic mythology in this role she is wed to the King of the Land who is wed to the soil and thus forms a stewardship of the land. This marriage to the land was symbolized by the future king standing on a sacred rock and swearing a vow. The Stone of Destiny was used for this purpose. Marriage to the land implies that the land is not a possession to be treated in any matter rather it is a living dynamic part of life to be cherished, loved, and protected. In the natal chart Rhiannon represents our connection to the land as part of our history, culture, and heritage. Strong aspects to this asteroid denote a deep sense of connection to the land and its history.

Rhiannon placed here feels a deep calling to guardianship and patronage of relationships which best embodies the art of hieros gamos or heaven and Earth married. This often occurs internally through the integration of opposites, but can be seen in the external world as well. Pisces is a mystical sign and Rhiannon placed here will enjoy spiritual practices which encourage them to worship nature and the elements. We may find them choosing to wear organic fabrics, drinking water or partaking of juice fasts more often than drinking tea/coffee, or they might simply be an avid gardener, arborist, or activist for the preservation of national parks, wetlands, etc. It is these who will see Divinity in the rocks, trees, oceans/streams, animals, and so forth. In the past and what is being rejuvenated is an understanding and appreciation of our great blue planet for we only have one and should do our best to protect and tend to her. Rhiannon placed in 7th House Pisces may be a key to this mystery. Being a water element Pisces fertilizes the Earth so that both nature and creativity may incubate and bloom.

Moon Phase

The New Moon placement indicates one who feels more introverted, low in energy requiring more rest or sleep, and one who spends time reflecting on past mistakes to see where they went wrong in an effort to set intentions for the coming weeks, months, and years ahead. One should allow changes into their life to reap long term rewards. Visualization is a skill this placement should practice. If the New Moon placement learns to have faith and trust while taking practical actions towards life renewal they will manifest naturally. Ensure the goals set are realistic and seek out the necessary tools, skills, and strategies needed to turn your intentions into reality.

New Moon brings forth one who has many ideas yet lacks the energy to start putting these plans into action. Look towards the Waxing Gibbous phase to gain supportive energies for putting the seeds of the New Moon into your daily existence. Spiritually this is a time of new directions, darkness, and meditation. Write your plans and objectives into a journal. For ritual work one may choose to sit under the Moon listening to music, burning incense, and creating an ambience they love to spend time in.

Know that change takes effort and planning, be honest with personal habits and thoughts which are blocking progress from being made, and make plans to overcome inner and external limitations. Be cautious of leaping before looking first, rely on your intuition, and do not agree to things simply to please people. New Moon is when one must guard against being easily manipulated and persuaded to go against their will. Their need for solitude is due to how easily they are affected by other people's energies.
